

RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT BETWEEN WASHINGTON AND IDAHO REGARDING JOURNEYMAN PLUMBERS

MARCH 12, 1996

This agreement supersedes any previous agreement concerning this subject matter. Persons holding a Journeyman Plumber's Certificate of Competency in one signatory state may obtain a reciprocal certificate in another signatory state by meeting the following requirements:

- 1. The person seeking a reciprocal certificate of competency shall make application on a form provided by the state of application.
- 2. The applicant shall document experience by verification from previous employers. Records available from the state where the applicant currently holds a certificate of competency may be accepted by the state of application. A current certificate of competence will be sufficient documentation of experience.
- 3. The applicant shall meet the experience requirements for a certificate of competency of the state of application.
- 4. An applicant for a reciprocal certificate shall be a resident of the state in which he/she holds his/her certificate at the time he/she makes the application for a certificate by reciprocity to another state. A certificate by reciprocity shall not be granted to an individual residing in the state to which he/she is making application at the time he/she makes the application.
- Once an individual has made application for a certificate by application, a certificate may be granted to such individual only by examination, and he/she may not subsequently apply to that state for a certificate by reciprocity.
- 6. No written examination shall be required for the reciprocal certificate.
- 7. All applicants shall pay the applicable examination fees and pay the certificate fees of the state of application.
- Reciprocal certificate holders are responsible for the renewal of their certificate. A late renewal fee and/or re-examination can result when renewal is not accomplished in accordance with each states' respective statutes.

Each signatory board shall maintain such permanent records of applicants for Journeyman Plumber Certificate of Competency as necessary to document qualification, verified experience records, education, tests and scores for a period corresponding to each signatory's requirements, but for not less than six years.

This Agreement becomes effective on or before April 1, 1996. This Agreement may be terminated by any signatory state upon thirty days written notice.
