The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM MT by Chair Boorman.

Approval of 02/12/2026 Minutes:

A motion was made and seconded to approve the February 12, 2026, meeting minutes. The motion carried unanimously.

DIVISION BUSINESS

Financial Report: Executive Officer (EO) Bird presented the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026, Quarter 3 Financial Report.

BOARD BUSINESS

Election of Officers: A motion was made and seconded to elect Curtis Reno as Chair. The motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made and seconded to re-elect Evan Powers as Vice-Chair. The motion carried unanimously.

Excavation Damage Prevention Enforcement Program: Legal Counsel Arroyo provided an update on the underground damage prevention enforcement program noting that DOPLs request for reconsideration of the inadequacy of the program was denied. There will be an opportunity later in the year to show additional data that wasn't previously provided.

Education Report: Education and Training Specialist DeWitt presented the Education Report outlining the grant application process and the various training and outreach events planned for this year. Wendy Largent, President of the Bonner Boundary Utility Coordinating Council,

recommended that any education courses or guides that refer to 811 point the reader to the website where they can request the locations of underground utilities for their location.

NOV Report: Investigations Supervisor McClung provided the July 1, 2025, to May 26, 2026, Notice of Violations Report, noting that 142 cases have been reviewed to date. Of those cases, 92 resulted in violations. Of those, 84 were issued training in lieu of discipline and 8 were issued civil penalties.
